#### FROM THE DESK OF THE PARISH PRIEST



A wealthy man and his son loved to collect rare works of art. They had everything in their collection, from Picasso to Raphael. They would often sit together and admire the great works of art. When the Vietnam conflict broke out, the son went to war. He was very courageous and

died in battle while rescuing another soldier. The father was notified and grieved deeply for his only son.

About a month later, just before Christmas, there was a knock at the door. A young man stood at the door with a large package in his hands. He said, 'Sir, you don't know me, but I am the soldier for whom your son gave his life. He saved many lives that day, and he was carrying me to safety when a bullet struck him in the heart and he died instantly... He often talked about you, and your love for art.' The young man held out this package. 'I know this isn't much. I'm not really a great artist, but I think your son would have wanted you to have this.'

The father opened the package. It was a portrait of his son, painted by the young man. He stared in awe at the way the soldier had captured the personality of his son in the painting. The father was so drawn to the eyes that his own eyes welled up with tears. He thanked the young man and offered to pay him for the picture. 'Oh, no sir, I could never repay what your son did for me. It's a gift.' The father hung the portrait over his mantle. Every time visitors came to his home he took them to see the portrait of his son before he showed them any of the other great works he had collected.

The man died a few months later. There was to be a great auction of his paintings. Many influential people gathered, excited over seeing the great paintings and having an opportunity to purchase one for their collection. On the platform sat the painting of the son. The auctioneer pounded his gavel. 'We will start the bidding with this picture of the son. Who will bid for this picture?'

There was silence... Then a voice in the back of the room shouted, 'We want to see the famous paintings. Skip this one.' But the auctioneer persisted 'Will somebody bid for this painting? Who

will start the bidding? \$100, \$200?' Another voice angrily: 'We didn't come to see this painting. We came to see the Van Gogh's, the Rembrandts. Get on with the Real bids!' But still the auctioneer continued. 'The son! The son! Who'll take the son?'

Finally, a voice came from the very back of the room. It was the long-time gardener of the man and his son. 'I'll give \$10 for the painting...' Being a poor man, it was all he could afford. 'We have \$10, who will bid \$20?' 'Give it to him for \$10. Let's see the masters.'

The crowd was becoming angry. They didn't want the picture of the son. They wanted the more worthy investments for their collections. The auctioneer pounded the gavel.. 'Going once, twice, SOLD for \$10!' A man sitting on the second row shouted, 'Now let's get on with the collection!'

The auctioneer laid down his gavel. 'I'm sorry, the auction is over.' 'What about the paintings?' 'I am sorry. When I was called to conduct this auction, I was told of a secret stipulation in the will... I was not allowed to reveal that stipulation until this time. Only the painting of the son would be auctioned. Whoever bought that painting would inherit the entire estate, including the paintings. The man who took the son gets everything!'

God gave His son over 2,000 years ago to die on the Cross. Much like the auctioneer, His message today is: 'The Son, the Son, who'll take the Son?' Because, you see, whoever takes the Son gets everything!

When God gave us Jesus, He gave us not just His best, but also everything. We are truly rich because we have Christ, our all in all. When we have Jesus, we truly have everything. Jesus is our wisdom, our righteousness, our sanctification, our redemption and our success. In Him are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge.

My dear friends, when you need wisdom, Christ is your wisdom. When you need righteousness, Christ is your righteousness. When you need sanctification and redemption, Christ is both to you. When you need faith, He is your faith. When you are fearful of the odds against you, He is your favour. When you are weak, He is your strength. When you are troubled and anxious, He is your peace. When you feel vulnerable, He is your shield. When you are lonely, He is your faithful companion. And when you are sick, He is your healing and health. Jesus, the great I AM says to you, "I AM to you whatever you need Me to be!" We are truly rich because we have Christ. And in Christ we are complete.



On 24th March 2019 Catholic Association of Bengal – St. Mary's Church Unit and Society of St. Vincent de Paul, St. Mary's Unit jointly organized the blood donation Camp. Regular announcement was made for a month or so and 58 persons had registered their names to donate blood. But, on the day of the event many of those who had registered their names failed to be present. However, those who have not registered their names came up to donate blood and eventually 33 people donated blood. Mr. Michael Lindsay took the lead in contacting LIFE CARE BLOOD BANK and making all arrangements for the doctors and their team to be present by 8.30 a.m. so that those who come for 7.15 a.m. Mass could donate their blood and then go home. Sincere thanks to those who donated blood because your blood could save many lives. The Blood donation cards will be given to those who donated blood. But their names will be registered with the parish and when in need anyone could approach the Parish priest and obtain the phone number and could request for their card to obtain blood from the blood bank. Congratulations to the members of CAB and SVP of St. Mary's Church for making all arrangements and making all efforts to collect 33 units of blood.

The next day, the little group, followed by other children, again gathered at the feet of the Mother of God. Next came their mothers, to join the little assembly. Soon, other groups were formed, and the devotion rapidly became popular. People who are troubled by their disorderly conduct saw in these growing practices the hand of God, and they cooperated with the designs of Providence by approving and promoting this new devotion, as a public and solemn act of reparation. The Month of Mary was founded.

This is the month in which, in the churches and individual homes, the most affectionate and fervent homage of prayers and devotions from the hearts of Christians are raised to Mary. In our own times, we Catholics, wanting to be close to her always, offer her special presents in May: pilgrimages, visits to churches dedicated to her, little sacrifices in her honour, periods of study and well-finished work offered up to her, and a more attentive recitation of the rosary. # RECOLLECTION DAY AT ST. MARY'S CHURCH: 31.03.2019


A day of recollection was organized for the parishioners of St. Mary's Church on 31st March 2019. Mr. Charles Sassoon, the Director of the Laity Cell of the Parish, contacted Fr. Linus, VC of Emmaus Center at Sarat Bose Road to organize the day's programme. About 180 persons had registered their names to join in the recollection, including a few parishioners from the Church of Christ the King and St. Thomas' Church. However, about 150 people came to spend time in prayer and reflection. The day began with Mass presided over by Fr. Linus, VC of Emmaus Centre, Kolkata and concelebrated by the Parish Priest. Fr. Linus spoke about the need to reconcile ourselves with God and with one another during this season of Lent. The purpose of organizing a day of recollection was to have a meaningful preparation to celebrate Easter. Mr. Charles Sassoon along with Ms. Sandra Singh, Mr. Dominic Saldanha and Shirin Saldanha led the people in praise and worship. After lunch Fr. Neethi Dass took over to prepare for Confession and healing. For an hour or so he spoke on the love of God and our response to him. Many people availed of the opportunity to make confession as a preparation for the celebration of Easter. Fr. Linus concluded the day with his talk and blessing of the people with the exposed Blessed Sacrament. The Parish priest thanked Fr. Linus for being with us and guiding people to reflect on their own life and see how we can reconcile with God and with one another. He also thanked Mr. Charles Sassoon for organizing the whole day's programme and .Ms. Sandra Singh, Mr. Dominic Saldanha and Mrs. Shirin Saldanha for making the day's programme more prayerful with their singing.

## GOOD FRIDAY WAY OF THE CROSS ON THE STREETS: 19.04.2019

As in the past on Good Friday the way of the Cross on the streets was held at 7.00 a.m. About 300 parishioners had gathered together in the parish hall well before time. After the introduction by the Parish Priest and singing of a hymn the procession began. The way of the Cross was prayed in three languages at different spots - Starting from St. Mary's Church at 92 Ripon Street, the procession proceeded to Ripon Street to Rafi Ahmed Kidwai Street, Royd Street, Elliot Road and back to St. Mary's Church on Ripon Street.

Women in the parish take active part in all parish activities. Most of the lectors are women. Like last year this year too women helped to carry the cross on the streets remembering what Jesus had done on Good Friday. Thanks to all those who joined in the way of the Cross on the streets. Let us continue carrying our daily crosses so that others may live. Jesus said to his disciples, "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23). In Jesus' day, a cross wasn't just a symbol of pain and suffering; it was mainly a symbol of death. What Jesus is telling us is that we need to put to death our own plans and desires, and then turn our lives over to Him and do His will every day. Let us seek His will and not our own will to be happy in our lives.

## **EXTRACT FROM POST SYNODAL EXHORTATION "CHRISTUS VIVIT"**



40. The Synod recognized that "a substantial number of young people, for all sorts of reasons, do not ask the Church for anything because they do not see her as significant for their lives. Some even ask expressly to be left alone, as they find the presence of the Church a nuisance, even an irritant. This request does not always stem from uncritical or impulsive contempt. It can also have serious and understandable reasons: sexual and financial scandals; a clergy ill-prepared to engage effectively with the

sensitivities of the young; lack of care in homily preparation and the presentation of the word of God; the passive role assigned to the young within the Christian community; the Church's difficulty in explaining her doctrine and ethical positions to contemporary society".[15]

41. Although many young people are happy to see a Church that is humble yet confident in her gifts and capable of offering fair and fraternal criticism, others want a Church that listens more, that does more than simply condemn the world. They do not want to see a Church that is silent and afraid to speak, but neither one that is always battling obsessively over two or three issues. To be credible to young people, there are times when she needs to regain her humility and simply listen, recognizing that what others have to say can provide some light to help her better understand the Gospel. A Church always on the defensive, which loses her humility and stops listening to others, which leaves no room for questions, loses her youth and turns into a museum. How, then, will she be able to respond to the dreams of young people? Even if she possesses the truth of the Gospel, this does not mean that she has completely understood it; rather, she is called to keep growing in her grasp of that inexhaustible treasure.[16]

42. For example, a Church that is overly fearful and tied to its structures can be invariably critical of efforts to defend the rights of women, and constantly point out the risks and the potential errors of those demands. Instead, a living Church can react by being attentive to the legitimate claims of those women who seek greater justice and equality. A living Church can look back on history and acknowledge a fair share of male authoritarianism, domination, various forms of enslavement, abuse and sexist violence. With this outlook, she can support the call to respect women's rights, and offer convinced support for greater reciprocity between males and females, while not agreeing with everything some feminist groups propose. Along these lines, the Synod sought to renew the Church's commitment "against all discrimination and violence on sexual grounds".[17] That is the response of a Church that stays young and lets herself be challenged and spurred by the sensitivities of young people.
